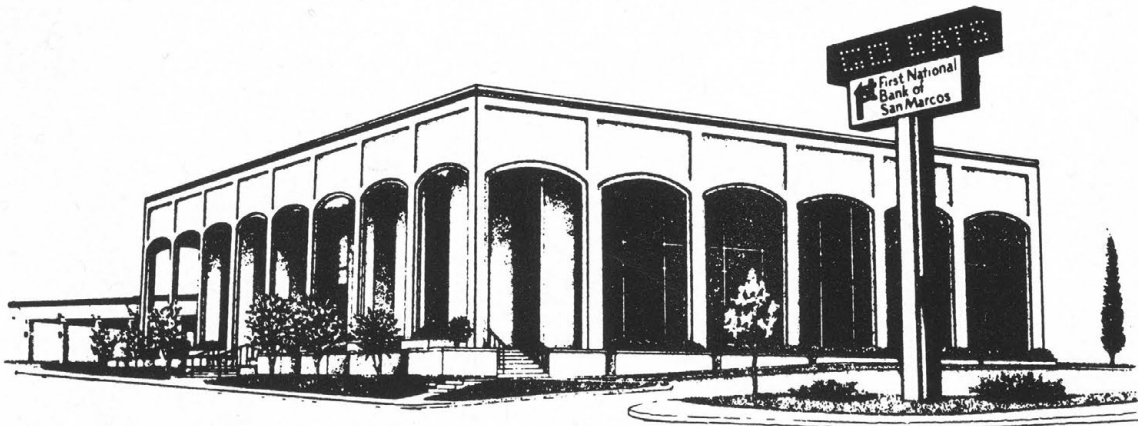

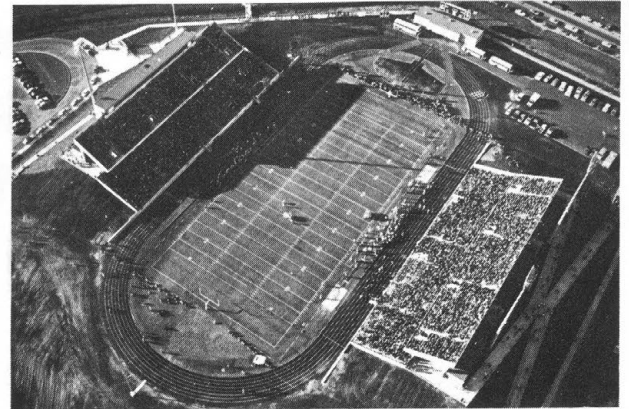

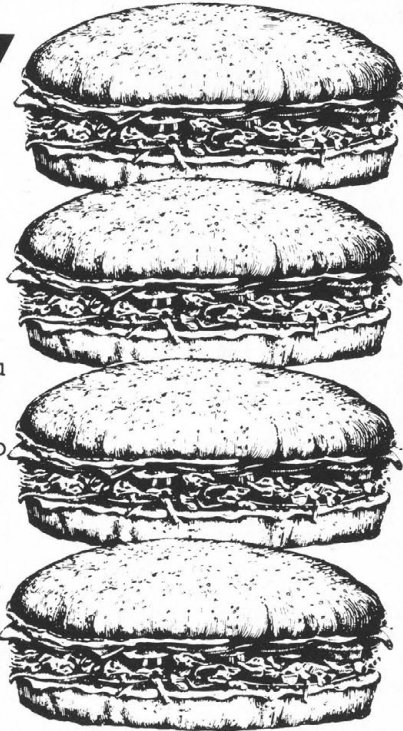

Today's Game

Southwest Texas State begins its quest for a third straight Lone Star Conference football championship tonight, hosting the rebuilding Yellow Jackets of Howard Payne University.

The Bobcats, 4-0 and on top of the NCAA Division II national rankings, are heavy favorites, but Jim Wacker warned earlier this week: "Every Sunday you pick up the paper and read about upsets by teams that are rebuilding...we've got to make sure we are not one of those victims."

Bill Hicks is HPU's new coach. Hicks went from one Baptist institution to another as he left as Baylor's defensive line coach to try to rebuild a program in Brownwood which hasn't had a winning season since 1973. That was also the last time the Stingers defeated SWT and the Bobcats lead the series, 28-25-3.

SWT got its final non-conference tuneup last Saturday with a 34-21 romp over Southeastern Louisiana in a game that really wasn't that close. Afterward, Wacker sounded a note of optimism. "We've got a chance to again be a very good football team if we don't take anybody for granted," Wacker said.

Prior to Saturday's game, Wacker had not been pleased with the offense. But last week, the 'Cats rolled up a 34-0 lead before SLU scored 21 points against the reserves. Senior quarterback Ron Jacoby had 89 yards on eight carries and completed five of 10 passes for 88 yards in just over two quarters of action and gave the kind of leadership Wacker had been looking for from his field general.

SWT is now averaging 362.5 yards a game, while giving up just 164. The 'Cats lead every conference defensive statistic: total defense, rushing defense (79.0), passing defense (85.0) and scoring defense (8.8). Howard Payne, on the other hand, is last in total offense (224.3) after a 1-2 start which saw them beat East Central Oklahoma, 13-10, and then lose to Texas Lutheran, 24-20, on the last play of the game, and Central Oklahoma, 42-7.

The defense is led by linebackers Tim Staskus and Cyril Friday and tackle Mike Langford. Staskus was named the LSC's defensive player of the week after the SLU game as he had eight tackles, two assists and 2½ sacks. Staskus and Friday, both juniors, lead the team in tackles with 38. Langford, a senior, is third with 30.

HPU is also proud of its senior linebacker, Levi Morrison, who has 41 tackles in just three games. Jacket punter Kirk Chastain is the class of the LSC with a 41.9. He was first team all-conference last year as a freshman.

SWT's Veer started to produce yards in big chunks last week. The explosiveness is reflected in the per carry averages of running backs Eric Cobble (9.7), David Sorrell (8.7) and Ricky Sanders (6.4) and Wacker has pledged he will try to get the ball to Cobble and Sorrell more, perhaps even placing Sorrell at flanker occasionally. All three run the 40 in the 4.4 to 4.5 range.

SWT's Strutters are playing host to area high school drill teams today. Those in attendance include Hitchcock, Tomball, San Antonio/Jay, Pearsall, Luling, San Marcos, Houston/Jersey Village, Austin/McCallum, San Marcos Academy, Leander and Kingsville.

The Bobcats meet Sam Houston State in Houston's Astrodome next Saturday at 7 p.m. Tickets are \$10.00, club level; \$7.00, reserved; and \$3.00 for SWT students with their I.D. A hospitality hour for all students, alumni, Bobcat Club members and others will be held from 4-5 p.m. in the Astrohall, and a meal will be served (\$5.00) from 5-6 prior to the game. Tickets are on sale from 8-5 daily at the Strahan Coliseum Box Office.

University --- --- Profile

Located at the foot of the Texas Hill Country, where blackland prairies turn into beautiful hills, Southwest Texas State University enjoys a setting that is unique among Texas universities. The beauty of the crystal clear San Marcos River and many sprawling cypress and pecan trees on the campus adds to the charm of the picturesque locale. Although the major metropolitan areas of Austin, San Antonio and Houston are not far away, San Marcos has managed to retain the charm of a small town, and SWT still has a real university atmosphere — a place where faculty and students take the processes of teaching and learning seriously.

From historic red-steepled Old Main, with its ivory-covered walls, to the Lyndon Baines Johnson Memorial Student Center with its modernistic dome-covered plaza, you get the feeling you are indeed on a college campus that is special.

Sound academic programming that combines the best of liberal arts education with professional career-oriented curricula provides students with a broad range of educational options. SWT, with an enrollment approaching 16,000, is "The Progressive University with a Proud Past" that strives to provide modern, quality education with a personal touch.

Robert L. Hardesty, a protege of SWT's most famous graduate, the late President Lyndon B. Johnson, became the school's seventh president on Nov. 1, 1981. Hardesty served in the White House from 1966 until he moved to Austin in 1969 as special assistant to the former President and editor of his memoirs. He also served as special assistant and press secretary to Gov. Dolph Briscoe from 1973 until 1976 when he joined the University of Texas system as vice chancellor for administration for the UT system.

Recent giant strides in intercollegiate athletics have been made under the guidance of Dr. Allan Watson, vice-president for University Affairs and the school's principal administrator in charge of athletics. Dr. Watson, who also serves as SWT's representative to the Lone Star Conference and NCAA, has pressed for new facilities which are now open, the harmonious consolidation of the men's and women's athletic programs under a new plan which has been studied as a model by other schools, significant budget increases, additional personnel and a greatly-expanded development program.

The development program, via the Bobcat Club organization, has resulted in the formation of chapters not only in San Marcos, but also in San Antonio, Houston, Austin, and Dallas. Contributions from outside sources for support of the athletic program will approach the \$200,000 mark this year.

Jim Wacker
Head Coach

Few can match the success of Southwest Texas State's Jim Wacker in his 11 seasons as a collegiate head football coach. Wacker, who took SWT to its first national title last season in just his third year as Bobcat coach, has had teams in the national playoffs five times and won three titles. His 1982 team has been picked to win a third straight Lone Star Conference

title and SWT will undoubtedly be one of the favorites for NCAA Division II post-season honors. To underscore the program which Wacker has built at SWT, a pre-season poll says the Bobcats have had the best recruiting year in the LSC for a third consecutive year.

Honors and a reputation as one of the top offensive minds in football have followed Wacker's success. He managed some 40 speaking engagements last spring, including a guest appearance at a national meeting of insurance salesmen in Hawaii where he spoke on motivation and organization. SWT's own coaching clinic, which features only members of the Bobcat staff, has become one of the most popular spring stops in Texas and last year attracted coaches from four states outside of Texas. He was the only college division coach invited to the NCAA 1982 Football Preview press confab in Kansas City in February and was a guest lecturer at the American Football Coaches' Association meeting. He was also Texas Senior College Coach of the Year, as selected by the Texas Sportswriters' Association and NCAA College Division District 6 Coach of the Year.

Wacker has co-authored, with Don Morton of North Dakota State, a popular book on the Veer offense. Ironically, Morton was Wacker's victim in the NCAA Division II title game in December of 1981.

Since Wacker debuted as a head coach at Texas Lutheran College in 1971, he has had only one losing season — that first one. The personable 45-year-old native of Detroit, Mich., is now 90-33-1 (.726) in all 11 seasons.

His SWT record is 28-8-0. In three seasons at North Dakota State prior to coming to San Marcos, he guided the Bison to two North Central Conference championships, two undefeated NCAA seasons and two of his five national playoff berths. His NDSU team was ranked No. 1 in the nation in Division II at the end of the 1977 regular season campaign. His first two NDSU teams went 9-3-0 and 9-2-1, respectively.

Wacker had gone to Fargo, N.D., after posting a sparkling mark at TLC. He quickly guided the Seguin school out of the depths to back-to-back NAIA Division II titles in 1974 and 1975. The Bulldogs were 11-0 in 1974 and 11-1-0 in 1975, winning 17 straight at one point and 26 of their last 27 games under Wacker.

Wacker, actually Dr. Wacker, holds a doctorate from the University of Nebraska, a bachelors from Valparaiso (Ind.) where he lettered three times and was co-captain and most valuable lineman in 1959, and a masters from Wayne State (Mich.).

Wacker began his coaching career with a 20-16 record at Concordia High in Portland, Ore., from 1960-63. He was defensive coordinator at Concordia College (Neb.) from 1964-68 and held the same job at Augustana College (S.D.) in 1969 and 1970 before coming to Texas and TLC. In college he was a roommate of Texas A&I Coach Ron Harms.

Wacker's father was a Lutheran minister and he teaches a Sunday school class at the local American Lutheran Church. A popular banquet speaker, Wacker has also presented seminars on organization and motivation to business and educational groups.

He was born April 28, 1937, in Detroit. He and his wife, Lil, have three sons — Mike, a junior basketball player at Texas, Steve and Tom.

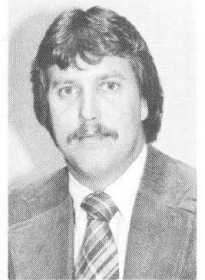

Bill Miller
Athletic Director

Bill Miller, one of the most respected and dedicated figures in Texas collegiate athletics, is in his 20th year on the SWT staff and his eighth as Director of Intercollegiate Athletics.

Miller became the school's fulltime Athletic Director in December of 1978 when he stepped down as football coach. He had been head football coach since 1965 and posted the winningest record in school history with an 86-51-3 (.614) ledger. Miller had been serving as both AD and football coach since the death of Milton Jowers in 1972. He first joined the SWT staff in 1961 as a football assistant to Jowers.

The personable Miller is only the third AD in SWT history. He is a product of two of the most successful coaches in Texas athletic history—Jowers and Paul Tyson. He was backfield coach for Jowers from 1961 until 1965 when he was named head coach, and he played for Tyson at now-defunct Daniel Baker in Brownwood in 1949-50.

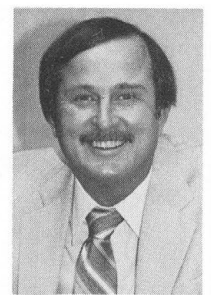
Miller, 51, became director of SWT's entire 11 sport intercollegiate program in 1975 when his duties were expanded to include the women's program.

Miller was born April 17, 1931, in Goldthwaite (in Central Texas). He played both football and basketball at Daniel Baker before serving in the Navy during the Korean conflict. Miller's wife, Dr. LaRue Miller, is a local public school administrator, and they have one son, Mike.



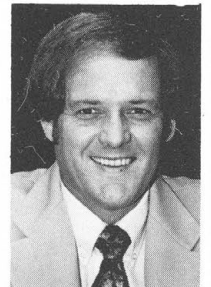

Who Is That Bobcat Mascot

Her antics have made more heads turn at Bobcat Stadium this football season than the combined efforts of young SWT ballboy Spud Friday and cohorts. With revelry ranging from "mowing" the playing field prior to a contest to lightheartedly mocking an opponent's mascot, she has added luster and character to a celebrity all-too familiar with SWT fans--the Bobcat mascot.

And in doing so, Michelle Carnes and the Bobcat mascot she brings to life each week manages to assist the cheerleaders, band and Strutters in keeping spirit up during the gridiron clashes in a totally different and refreshing manner.

A cheerleader all the way from fifth grade through her senior year at Killeen Ellison High School, 20-year-old Carnes chose to shy away from the collegiate cheerleading spectrum until she tried out for the role of Bobcat mascot last spring. It was a move made largely because of her interest in the football squad, but also one made due to a relationship with a sport that has been a part of her life since the age of three.

"My dad is a football coach at (Killeen) Ellison and my mother is secretary for the coaches at Killeen High," Carnes said. "I've grown up around football since I was three years old. I really love football and like to be a part of the action."

That enthusiasm for the game carries over to her limitless amount of energy she puts into her role as Bobcat mascot. Carnes takes her self-proclaimed "license to kill" as the mascot and goes all out in an effort to promote spirit during games and keep the fans interested in the action on the grid iron.

"I really like being a mascot better than cheerleader," said Carnes. "I'm not restricted, and I like that. It just takes a whole lot more time coming up with ideas."

Carnes said once she is inside the Bobcat mascot uniform, she does a complete reversal in roles and changes from mild mannered SWT coed Michelle Carnes to the wild and crazy Michelle Carnes, Bobcat mascot--and the fun begins.

"I have a lot more freedom as mascot--kind of a 'license to kill,' she

said. "I get in the suit and become someone different. You forget about yourself and are totally uninhibited. It's neat."

During the game, Carnes exhibits a varied routine in which she'll add as many as half a dozen different costumes to her Bobcat mascot uniform at different times. And her antics during the game consist of making rounds throughout the crowd--"I've already given out seven autographs," she claims--to wiping off sweat from the players' foreheads.

"When I'm out there, I feel I'm there solely to get the crowd motivated," said Carnes. "Like when the game gets boring and the team gets really ahead, you're there to get the crowd interested in the game again. I have to be flexible. When the game is close, I try not to distract the crowd from watching the game."

"I just try to make the crowd feel more a part of the game."

Carnes said her ideas for her various costumes and props--ranging from handing out bird feathers during the Lamar Cardinals game to carrying Col. Sanders chicken buckets during the Nicholls State Colonels clash--don't come too easily.

"For some reason, I usually don't get my inspiration until Thursday or Friday before the game," she said. "I'll walk around in Nostalgia Craze and it'll hit me. But my mother has been my

right hand all along and really helps a lot."

There are drawbacks to being mascot, though, as Carnes will admit--one being stuffed inside a hotter-than-hot Bobcat suit.

"The ultimate question is 'are you hot?' Well, for 30 or 40 minutes, it's painful. After that, you don't think about it," she said. "Against Lamar when it was so hot, I was dying--but when you're having fun, it's better. You have to constantly keep moving."

"But it's really weird," she added. "It's like a shot. It hurts at first, then the unbearable heat goes away."

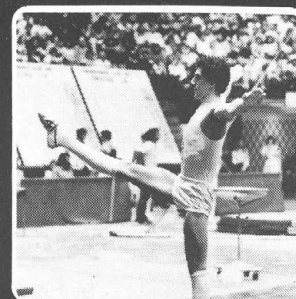
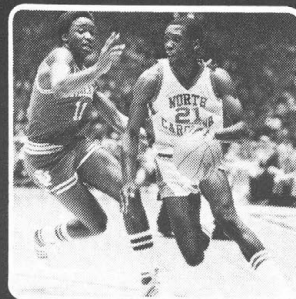
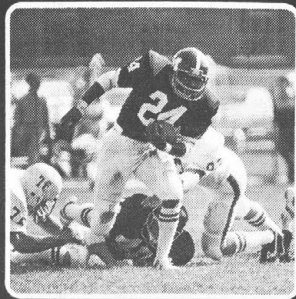

A New Basketball Era

In 1981 SWT sports fans looked forward to the first season in new Bobcat Stadium. In 1982 those same fans are anxiously awaiting basketball season in new Strahan Coliseum.

Bobcat cagers will open their season in the plush 7,200-seat facility and both Bob Derryberry and Dana Craft look for improved campaigns over last year.

Derryberry, who in his first season at the men's helm almost won a Lone Star Conference title with only one player back from the previous season, finds the cupboard full with seven lettermen, including three full-time and one part-time starter from last year's 16-10 team. The

Bobcats tied for second in the LSC and could have shared the title if eventual champion S.F. Austin had lost and SWT had won on the last night of the regular season. Derryberry was a strong candidate for Coach of the Year honors for his efforts which approached a complete rebuilding chore.

Returning are senior guard Kerry Murry, a first team all-LSC and honorable mention all-American, who averaged 18.7 points a game; guard Billy Bahnsen, the co-freshman of the year; and senior forward Rick Garrison who led the LSC in free throw shooting (.836), field goal shooting (.631) and ranked among the LSC leaders in scoring (11.9) and rebounding (6.1).

Tom Kerr, a 6-9 center, also started on occasion and returns with a 7.5 scoring norm and 5.0 rebounding mark in 17 games.

Among the top recruits are 6-5 Kevin Benford, Austin Del Valle; 6-1 transfer Billy Christle, Dallas South Oak Cliff; 6-6 John Clark, LaPorte; 6-7 Ray Danielak, San Antonio Jay; 6-5 transfer Kurt Lauer, Harlingen; and 6-6 Terry Posey, Springtown.

Both the men and women will make their home debuts in Strahan Coliseum on Nov. 30 when the \$8.8 million facility will be dedicated. Craft's women will play Texas A&I while the men tangle with Southland and NCAA I power Lamar University.

The Bobcat women not only look forward to a season in a new coliseum, but also the opportunity to compete for the first time for an LSC and NCAA title. The LSC incorporated women's sports into its championship program last spring and a single round robin schedule and post-season tournament will determine the first LSC basketball champion.

With the demise of the AIAW, the women's program will also compete with the men in the NCAA. SWT has announced its intention to place all of its athletic teams into the NCAA structure, leaving the NAIA for the first time in modern memory.

Craft returns nine lettermen from last year's 12-18 team, including every starter and the top seven scorers. Linda

Muelker, a 5-10 sophomore, led the team in scoring last year as a freshman (17.2), while injury-plaquet Karen Schroder (6-1) averaged 12.6 points and 11.6 rebounds in 22 games. Other top returnees are 5-9 Stacy Pfluger (11.6), 5-9 Jackie Sohr (10.8) and 5-10 Karen Kindrick (5.3). Craft has also brought in six junior college transfers and finds herself with the best overall height on a Bobcat team in many years. There won't be a women on the team under 5-6.

Craft also tuned her own notebook in the summer as an assistant for the South team in the U.S. Sports Festival and the U.S. Olympic Camp.

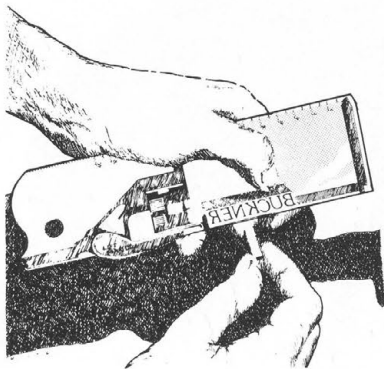

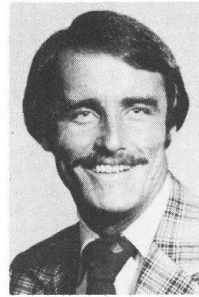
Bobcat Band and Strutters

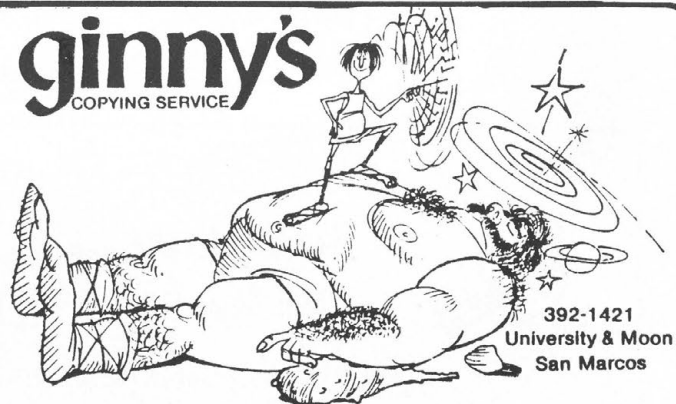

Academic All-America

A Very Cherished Award

Individual awards and recognition for an athlete's performance on the field have long been a valued part of college athletics. All-America and all-league honors are something to which each athlete on the field today aspires.

Over the past few years, there has been a growing awareness on the part of today's student-athlete of another type of award, an award that recognizes those individuals who have shown excellence both on the field of competition and in the classroom. To be labeled "Academic All-America" has rightfully come to represent the epitome of achievement for collegiate athletes.

"Like most athletes who have the opportunity to play at the Division I level, I've had my share of individual awards," said Norm Betts, an all-Big 10 tight end at Michigan who was named to the academic all-America first team.

"None of those awards means as much to me, however, as being called an academic all-America. That honor says so much. It says that I've excelled both on the field and in the classroom. That's not easy. The fact that I and others like me have been able to combine academics and athletics successfully shows that you can succeed both on the field and in the classroom if you work hard at both endeavors. It means so much to see that I've been recognized for what college athletics are meant to be. It's an award that will grow in stature as time passes," added Betts, a 3.89 student (on a 4.0 scale) in a pre-dentistry program. He's now enrolled in Michigan's School of Dentistry.

Since 1954, CoSIDA (College Sports Information Directors of America) has felt much like Norm Betts. Sports information directors have set out each year to select academic all-America teams in football, basketball and baseball. In recent years, women's basketball has been added to the ledger. The NCAA joined CoSIDA in 1980 in its effort to select and recognize those individuals on the national level who have distinguished themselves in both the classroom and in athletics.

"CoSIDA has long recognized the selection of these teams as a top organizational project," said Nick Vista, sports information director at Michigan State

University and president of CoSIDA until this past July. "We are very encouraged by the growing attention focused on this award because we feel it is the ultimate award for today's student-athlete. This is a person who is an exemplary by-product of the education process. This is a person who truly represents everything good about college athletics. We are all working very hard to make this the ultimate achievement and award in today's honor system for college athletics."

As befits such an award, the selection process is demanding. CoSIDA has divided the nation into eight geographical districts. Each district has an academic all-America coordinator who stays in touch with the sports information directors in the area. To be nominated for academic all-America honors, a student-athlete must have at least a 3.0 grade-point average (on a 4.0 scale) during the previous semester or on a cumulative basis throughout his/her collegiate career. The student-athlete must have been in residence at his/her current institution for at least a year and must be a starter or key reserve on his/her appropriate squad.

The sports information directors mail their nominations to the district coordinator for inclusion on the university or college division ballots. Updated biographical data (academic and athletic) also are included. The coordinator takes

these nominations, prepares a district voting ballot, mails it to the sports information directors in that district and then calculates the votes when they are returned. This "district academic team" then becomes eligible for the national ballot.

The district coordinator sends those results and further updated biographical data of the individuals to a national chair. The results of the eight district teams are compiled into a national voting ballot and sent to all CoSIDA members (over 1,000). They are instructed to vote for a certain number of individuals, depending on the team, and to return the voting ballot to their respective district coordinator. Votes from each of the eight areas are tabulated and sent to the national chair who announces the academic all-America team after final computations. It is a long and demanding process, but the results, in terms of the caliber of the respective teams and the individuals involved, have been quite impressive.

The 1981 football contingent had an average grade-point average for the 24-man team of 3.55. Twelve members of that team participated in postseason bowl games and another five participated in postseason all-star contests. Stanford running back Darrin Nelson, the first player in college football history to rush for more than 1,000 yards and catch 50 passes in a single season (he did it twice), and Nebraska center Dave Rimmington, winner of the Outland Trophy as college football's top lineman, headed the impressive gridiron squad.

Basketball was no different. Seven of the top 10 vote-getters on the men's team and four of the top 10 on the women's contingent played in postseason tournaments. The grade-point average for those squads was an amazing 3.76. Nearly 20 percent of the team had a grade-point average of 3.9 or above.

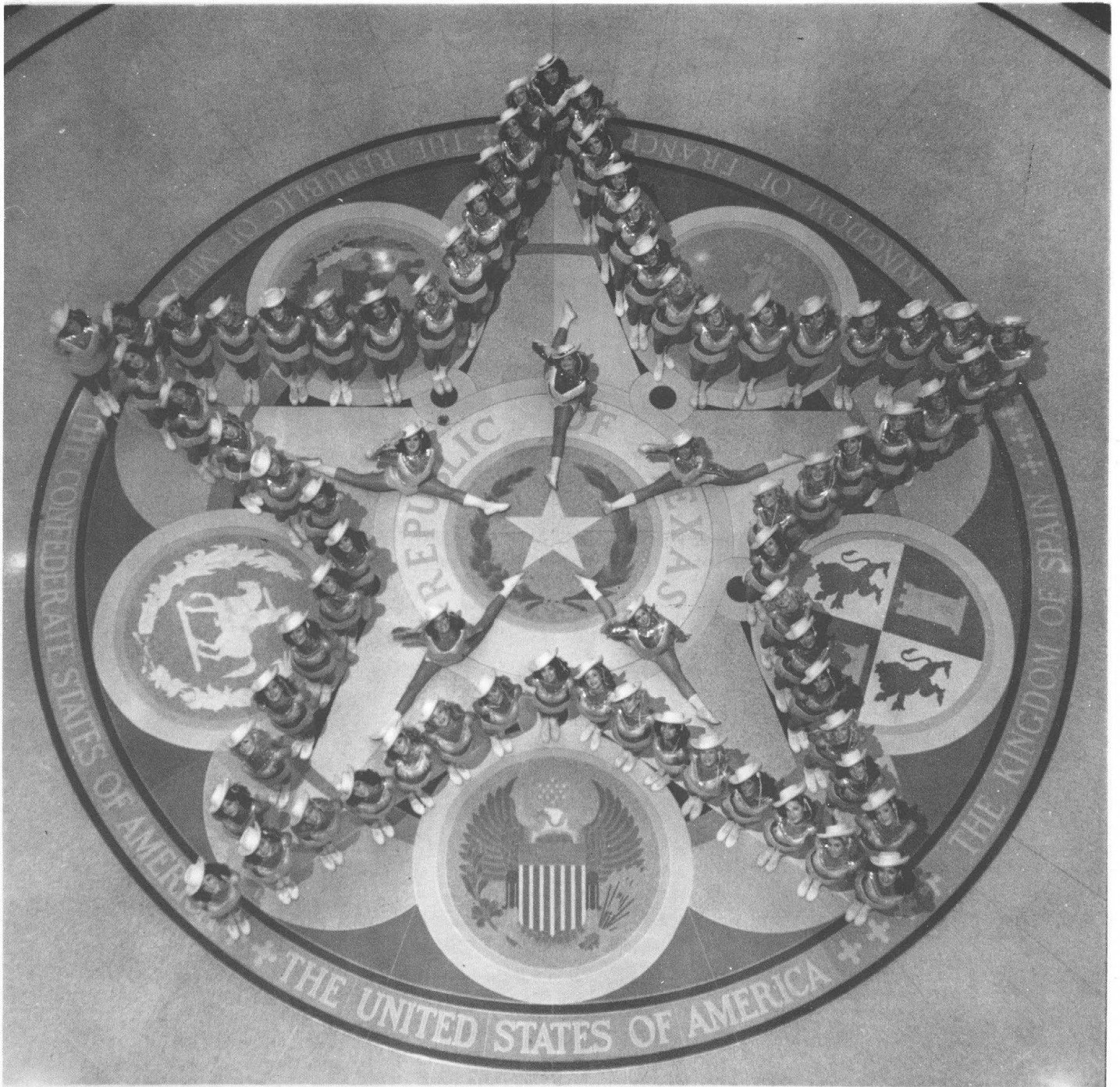
"The NCAA is very proud of what CoSIDA is doing in regards to publicizing such positive aspects of collegiate athletics," said Walter Byers, executive director of the NCAA. "There are many things about college athletics that we can all be proud of and the academic all-Americas definitely fit into that category."

Tops in the Classroom, Too

For the third straight year, Southwest Texas State football players have dominated academic honors in the Lone Star Conference.

Three Bobcat players earned first team LSC academic honors and five more received honorable (see all-LSC team listing). Nationally, quarterback Mike Miller was a first team all-America pick as selected by the College Sports Information Directors of America and was the school's first Rhodes Scholar nominee. He also received a \$2,000 NCAA post-graduate scholarship. SWT offensive guards Greg Gilcrease and Mike Wynn were second team all-America.

The all-Texas academic team, which includes universities of all classifications, included Gilcrease and offensive tackle Pete Racicot on the first unit, and Miller and Wynn on the honorable mention list. Miller was also recipient of the LBJ Outstanding Student award at SWT, marking the second year in a row a Bobcat football player has won the honor. In 1981, Mike Ferris, an academic all-America in 1980, received the LBJ award.

NCAA: Serving Higher Education

Now in its 77th year of service, the National Collegiate Athletic Association continues to meet the demands of its member institutions. While serving the nation's colleges and universities, the NCAA is the voice of intercollegiate athletics.

A call for stricter control of college football by President Theodore Roosevelt because of the violence in the game brought together 13 institutions in 1905, formulating the original communications base for college athletics.

This initial body called itself the Intercollegiate Athletic Association and was officially constituted March 31, 1906. In 1910, the name was changed to the National Collegiate Athletic Association.

More than seven progressive decades have molded this original 13-member body into a membership today of more than 900 colleges, universities, conferences and affiliated organizations.

Administration and rules interpretation occupied early efforts of the organization. Shortly after World War II, the NCAA adopted legislative and executive powers, changing its function into one dealing with virtually all issues concerned with intercollegiate athletics.

Many things have become associated with the NCAA during its colorful history. Highest priority goes to the service it provides to its members, acting as the true "voice" of college athletics today.

Each January the NCAA membership comes together at the annual Convention to review, propose and amend legislation. The Convention presents the opportunity for the nation's institutions of higher learning to speak and act on athletic matters on the national level.

Acting in the best interests of its membership, the NCAA strives to perform these specific functions among its many other responsibilities:

- Conducts 42 annual National Collegiate Championships in 19 men's sports for three separate divisions. Three championships (Division I, Division II and Division III) are held in baseball, basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, swimming, tennis, outdoor track and wrestling. Two championships are staged in gymnastics, lacrosse and ice hockey. Fencing, rifle, skiing, indoor track, volleyball and water polo hold single National Collegiate Championships, while football is contested in Divisions I-AA, II and III. The NCAA is conducting 31 women's championships

in the 1982-83 academic year in addition to the 42 held for men. Women's championships will be held in all three divisions in basketball, cross country, field hockey, softball, swimming, tennis, outdoor track and volleyball. Two championships (Division I and Division II) will be staged in gymnastics, while fencing, golf, lacrosse, soccer and indoor track will hold single National Collegiate Championships. The National Collegiate Championship dates back to 1883 in tennis; and during this 100-year history, more than 13,000 student-athletes have earned the coveted title of "National Collegiate Champion."

- Maintains 23 men's sports committees, including 14 men's rules committees to formulate, copyright and publish rules of play for the government of collegiate sports. Members of these and many other committees, including 16 women's sports/rules committees, are elected by representatives of member institutions at the annual Convention.

- Publishes a tabloid newspaper 46 times per year, rules books in 12 sports, record books in football and basketball and various other publications.

- Collects, compiles and distributes the official statistics of college football, basketball and baseball in men's sports, and basketball and softball in women's sports.

- Conducts studies as a means of developing solutions to athletic problems.

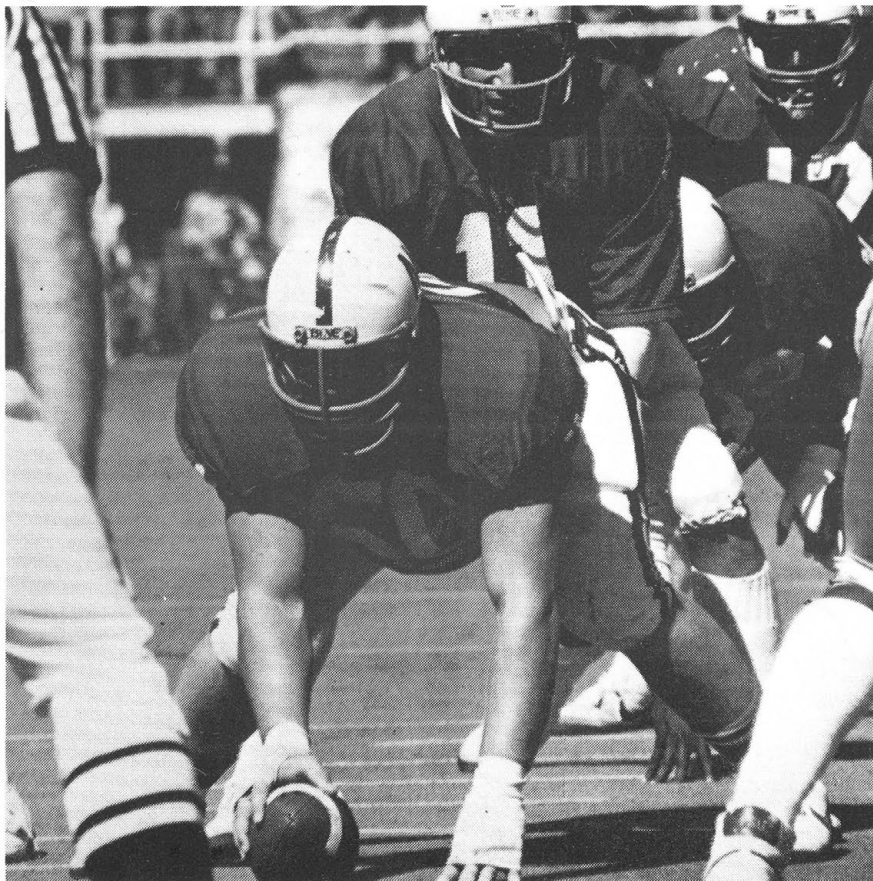
- Represents the membership in legislative and regulatory matters on the state and Federal levels.

- Annually selects the College Athletics Top Ten and the Theodore Roosevelt ("Teddy") Award—the Association's highest honor.

- Administers an honors program which annually awards 90 postgraduate scholarships to recognize outstanding senior student-athletes who have excelled in the classroom as well as athletics. This scholarship is for \$2,000. The program has provided \$1,784,000 to 1,354 recipients since its inception in the 1964-65 academic year.

- Promotes and participates in international sports planning and competition through membership in the United States Olympic Committee, Amateur Basketball Association of the USA, Track and Field Association of the USA, and the United States Baseball, Gymnastics and Wrestling Federations.

- Maintains more than 80 full-time staff members at its national headquarters in Mission, Kansas, under the supervision of Executive Director Walter Byers.



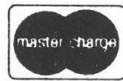



SWT Continues Domination Of LSC All-Sports Trophy

Southwest Texas State won its third consecutive Lone Star Conference all-sports championship in 1981-82, to continue a domination of the LSC which started in 1979. SWT has now won or shared the all-sports title — symbolic of the LSC's best overall athletic program — six times, more than any other LSC school.

Last year the Bobcats won LSC titles in football, golf and tennis, piling up 57 points. Angelo State was a distant second with 48 points. The 'Cats followed the conference titles, with national titles in football and tennis and a second place finish in the national golf tournament. The trio of wins marked only the second time a school has won three straight all-sports titles. Lamar University won three in a row starting in 1960 when the trophy was first initiated. SWT also finished second in cross country, tied for second in basketball and fourth in track and field. SWT also won a state title in women's gymnastics.

SWT became the first LSC school to join the NCAA in 1979 and was also the first to compete in NCAA national competition in 1980. All LSC members have now joined the NCAA and pledged themselves to the NCAA Division II playoff structure after a long affiliation with the NAIA. Also, for the first time this year, the LSC will declare women's championships in volleyball, basketball, tennis, and track and field.

The LSC was founded in April of 1931 with five schools from the old Texas Intercollegiate Athletic Association. SWT, along with East Texas, Sam Houston and S.F. Austin, were charter members as was North Texas State which withdrew in 1949. Other current members are Abilene Christian, Angelo State, Howard Payne and Texas A&I. Houston, Lamar, McMurry, Sul Ross and Tarleton State have also been members of the LSC.



Coach Neal Kinlund led SWT to another NAIA National title in June of 1982, and the 'Cats will host the NCAA II National Tournament in May of 1983.

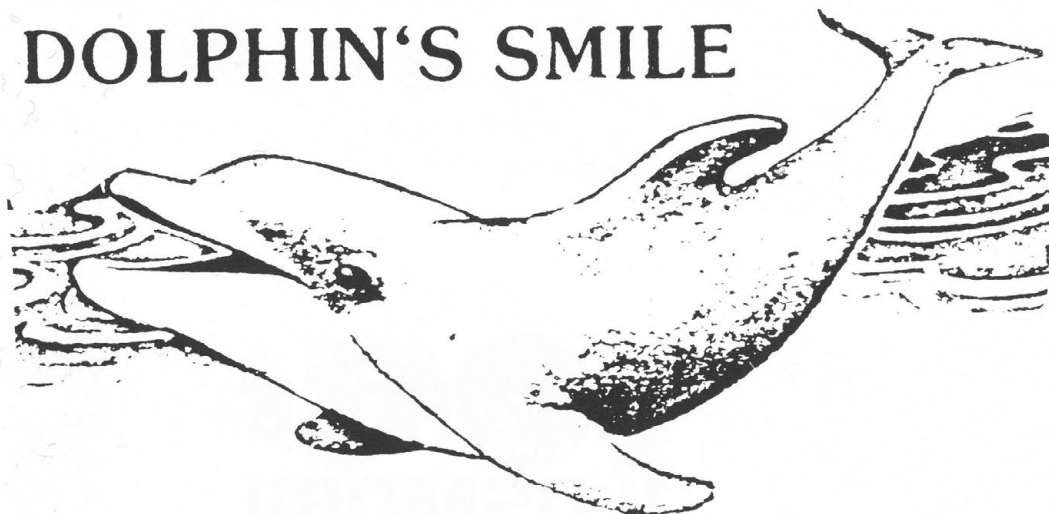

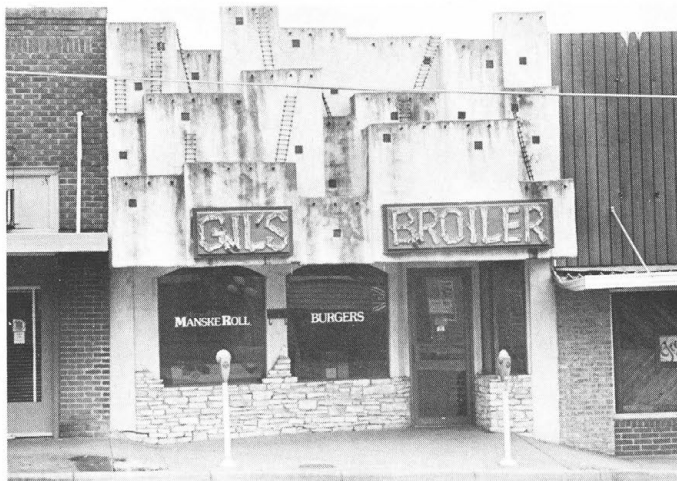
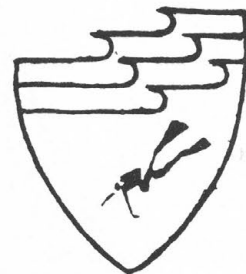

Howard Payne University

Howard Payne University today is one of the distinctive private liberal arts institutions in Texas. From traditional buildings like Old Main to the modern Guy D. Newman Hall of American Ideals, the HPU campus signifies an educational institution, which backed by years of tradition and history, still continues to move toward a better learning environment.

HPU's core curriculum is geared to vocational objectives for each student and permits greater freedom of choice in the selection of courses, a departure from the rigid major-minor curricula found in most universities.

Several innovative programs are offered by the University. One is the Douglas MacArthur Academy of Freedom, an honors program in social science which has attracted world-wide attention. The school, which has an enrollment of more than 1,500 students, offers six degrees--Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Science, Bachelor of Business Administration, Bachelor of Music, Bachelor of Music Education and Bachelor of General Studies.

Through strong academic programs and small classes, numerous activities and recreational opportunities, Howard Payne stands firm in the belief that her students are her most important asset. More than 80 faculty members, the majority of which hold earned doctorates, are available to help students in any way possible. In helping students, HPU annually awards more than \$2 million in financial assistance to students.

There are 18 permanent buildings on campus, most of which are red brick and modern or colonial styles of architecture. The newest is the Phelps Bible Building, completed in August, which houses the School of Christianity.

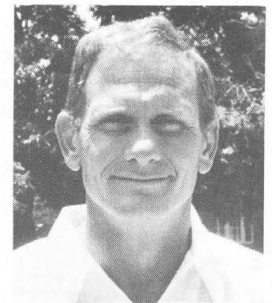
